"The International Vedic Workshop is the most prominent conference of Indologists involved in the study of the Vedas all over the world."

As in all earlier International Vedic Workshops, the research to be represented at the Eighth International Vedic Workshop shares not only a common subject area, viz. Vedic texts and the language and ritual reflected in these, but also an acceptance of the importance of the philological method in dealing with these texts, where possible supplemented with Vedic 'fieldwork'. The proceedings of the first International Vedic Workshop, published in 1997, including the Introduction by Michael Witzel, are in this respect exemplary.



VENUE AND TIME-TABLE

The conference will be organized both in sessions for the presentation of papers and in panels on related topics. The organizers will make every effort to ensure that there will be no parallel sessions in order to encourage the fullest participation.

The conference will begin on the morning of Monday, September 18, 2023, and close on Friday evening, September 22. Participants should plan to arrive by the evening of Sunday, September 18, and the departure should be planned not earlier than Saturday morning, September 23.

The sessions and possibly panels of the conference take mostly place on the new humanities campus, Campus Condorcet, Aubervilliers (closest metro station: Front Populaire), except on Thursday, with the morning session in the Institut National d'Histoire de l'Art (INHA) and the afternoon (on Vedic manuscripts) in the Bibliothèque Nationale de France (closest metro stations for both these venues on Thursday are: Bourse, Palais Royal, Pyramides).

The working hours for the conference are from 9h to 12h30 and from 14h30 to 18h or 18h30. The total time for presentation of a paper is expected to be 30 minutes: 20 minutes for the paper and 10 minutes for discussion.


In addition, several hotels from 2 to 5 stars are at a moderate distance from the main venue of the conference, Campus Condorcet, Aubervilliers, especially near the Stade de France. Metro line 12 has a stop, Front Populaire, just next to the Campus Condorcet, which connects, on one side, to Paris *intra muros*, and on the other side to the town Aubervilliers.

The Campus is just south of the Stade de France, and Ibis hotel Saint-Denis Stade Sud (Address: rue de la Cokerie, Saint Denis La Plaine, tel. +33 (0) 1 55 93 36 00; fax +33 (0) 1 55 93 36 36) is at ca. 2,5 kilometers north from the conference venue at Campus Condorcet.

Immediately next to this is budget hotel HotelF1.com Stade de France (rue de la Cokerie, Saint Denis La Plaine, tel. +33 (0) 8 91 70 53 78; fax +33 (0) 1 55 93 46 05).
