
# First Circular and Call for Abstracts

We are delighted to announce that, as agreed by the International Association of Sanskrit Studies (IASS) at the 17<sup>th</sup> World Sanskrit Conference (Vancouver, Canada, 2018), the 19<sup>th</sup> World Sanskrit Conference will be held in Kathmandu, Nepal from December 17 to December 21, 2024. The 19<sup>th</sup> WSC will mark the safe return from the necessity of virtual meetings, induced by the pandemic, to the tradition of travelling to the conference venue to meet, in person, prominent Indologists and Sanskrit scholars from all over the world. It shall also be the fifth World Sanskrit Conference to be held in South Asia and the first ever to be held in Nepal – a land that has preserved some of the oldest Sanskrit manuscripts, inscriptions, and ancient monuments, where Mount Everest stands tall amid the Himalayas, where the Śākyamuni Buddha was born, and some of the greatest Sanskrit traditions flourished and thrived for centuries. And as such, we are most eager to welcome you to Kathmandu, the heart of the country and the crux of the culture that flourished north of the Gangetic plains throughout the ages.









#### **General Information**

The 19<sup>th</sup> World Sanskrit Conference (WSC) will be held in Kathmandu, Nepal, from the 17<sup>th</sup> to the 21<sup>st</sup> of December, 2024. The conference will adhere to the standard *modus operandi* followed by the preceding conferences: there shall be 22 regular thematic sections, and each section will have its Conveners, who will be in charge of evaluating and promoting individual papers for presentation at the conference and nominating the session chairs. Moreover, the Conveners will eventually oversee the selection and edition of papers for publication in the conference proceedings.

## **Call for Papers and Panel Submissions**

WSC2024 invites individual papers to be presented in one of the 22 regular sections. We are also calling for proposals for special panels. Interested scholars are welcome to submit either an abstract for an individual paper to a regular section or to propose a special panel of four to six participants through the conference website at <u>www.nepalworldsanskrit.org</u>. The deadline for panel proposals is 31 December 2023, and the deadline for individual paper abstracts is 15 March 2024. Successful panel proposals will be announced in the Second Circular. Scholars will be invited to submit abstracts to these special panels after that date.

Each paper will be allotted a time of 20 minutes, with an additional 10 minutes for discussion. Papers may be delivered in English or Sanskrit. We encourage scholars who are presenting a paper in Sanskrit to provide a summary in English.

All participants who plan to present a paper must pay their registration fee by 15 September 2024, or their paper will be cancelled. Last-minute registration will be available only for non-presenting participants and guests.

#### **Registration Fees**

The Organizing Committee has been working to keep the registration fees as low as possible. At the moment, we are unable to announce the registration fees and other price values, but they will be announced as soon as we are able to finalize our anticipated costs. **The registration will open in early 2024**, and there will be discounted rates for **early-bird registration**. All confirmed presenters will be required to pay the registration fees before the 15<sup>th</sup> of September, 2024, to avoid cancellation of papers.



## **IASS** membership

The International Association for Sanskrit Studies (IASS) is the governing body that oversees the organization of the triennial World Sanskrit Conferences. For this reason, the conference registration will also be an occasion to purchase the renewal of their membership (for old members) and to gain membership of the IASS (for newcomers). #### Travel and visa

The Government of Nepal provides visa on arrival to *almost* all foreign nationals. Moreover, Indian Nationals do not need a visa to enter Nepal.

However, there is a list of 12 countries, whose citizens must have obtained a visa from their local Nepali Embassy/Consulate/Visa Office *prior* to their departure for Nepal. Hence, we request you to check the Nepali Government's official website to see whether your country falls on the list (https://www.immigration.gov.np/page/visa-on-arrival). If your country is not on the list, it means that you are eligible for a visa on arrival, which can be easily obtained upon landing at the International Airport in Kathmandu, Nepal. As soon as your abstract has been accepted, we will be able to provide a letter of confirmation, which will help you secure travel funds and serve as documentation for the visa.

#### **Travel grants**

Travel to Nepal is, comparatively, not too expensive. However, we regret to inform you that, due to our limited budget, the World Sanskrit Conference is unable to provide travel grants to the attendees. Therefore, we urge the participants to seek travel assistance and grants from their respective institutions or from governmental or international granting agencies.



#### Accommodation in Kathmandu

We have been negotiating with various hotels and guest-houses near the conference venue, in order to provide reasonable rates to the participants. Further details, including a list of possible accommodations at a walking distance from the conference, will be communicated in future announcements.
